Summer is our **biggest Critical Need challenge of the year** with donor activity at it's lowest due to people taking time off, traveling, celebrating upcoming holidays and festivities.

- ⇒ Yet, emergency situations & injuries are also on the rise, putting greater strain on available blood resources.
- ⇒ Ex: 1 car accident victim could need 100 units of blood.
- ⇒ Below is a look at our hospital's weekly inventory and orders for patients.

Current Blood Inventory July 1st – July 7th:

- ⇒ Most patient orders for Type O- blood have been reduced due to limited quantities.
- ⇒ All *Platelet supply orders are experiencing "some" reductions* due to insufficient supplies.
- ⇒ Type B- blood is experiencing "some" reductions as well due to insufficient supplies.
- ⇒ All blood types are needed; Type O Blood especially.
- ⇒ Power Red Donors critically needed.
- ⇒ For donating, you will receive \$20 Amazon.com gift card via email from Amazon





- Discover coping techniques, such as breathing exercises and meditation, to help you manage the pain of loss.
