About a year and a half ago as part of a Lenten series of Mission Ministry Team guest speakers, entitled "Who Is My Neighbor," we heard from a representative of Reconciling In Christ about ways we can expand our hospitality and welcome as a congregation. #### BUILDING AN INCLUSIVE CHURCH TRAINING

#### RIVER FALLS COMMUNITY PACKING EVENT


**SEPTEMBER 11-12, 2024!!**

Whether you are newly bereaved or have been walking this path for some time, this webinar will offer you a deeper understanding of how to integrate mindfulness into your holiday experience, fostering resilience and self-care.



#### Presenter, Heather Stang will discuss:

- Discover coping techniques, such as breathing exercises and meditation, to help you manage the pain of loss.
- Learn practical strategies for creating new holiday traditions that honor your grief and balance the needs of you and your family.
- Develop tools for mindful and compassionate self-care, including setting limits and emotional regulation during holiday gatherings.
