The Ministry of HOPE's Council: Naming Our Values Deep Look at Value 1

The HOPE Ministry Council has been faithfully exploring HOPE's values over the last six months. This has been diligent, engaging, and meaningful work and we are excited to share what the Holy Spirit has helped us discover! Our work was rooted in our current mission statement:

HOPE is called by God to look beyond ourselves. We walk together in faith, treasuring all people and sharing with them the love, hope and acceptance that is in Christ.

Here are the values we have faithfully discerned together: HOPE Values...

- All people without exception
- Serving generously
- Spiritual Nourishment
- Our connection with creation

Our first may seem obvious, but this topic spurred the greatest deal of conversation. We wrestled with what it truly means when our mission statement says, "treasuring all people." How will truly, ALL, people trust that we say what we mean and mean what we say? We know that nearly every church under the sun would say *all are welcome, only to find out that such a welcome actually comes with conditions. It was important to us, as we believe it is important to all who gather as a community of faith here at HOPE, that anyone who finds themself in contact with HOPE would feel 100% welcomed, without a doubt.*

After looking at a number of other websites from churches we knew value "welcome" we got a sense of some better language to describe what we are talking about when we talk about HOPE. A sister congregation in Eau Claire describes their welcome as:

We recognize that every person has a valuable story that carries infinite worth. We are called by Jesus to love expansively and make this unwavering pledge to welcome all people, without exception. We affirm the image of God in people of all sexual orientations, gender identities and expressions, relationship status, physical or mental ability, health status, and cultural or ethnic identity. In our church family we welcome all regardless of socioeconomic situation, addiction, imprisonment, or anything else that too often divides us.

As we explored more, we actually discovered that quite a few describe their welcome in this way. Some are simpler and just say "without exception." Discussion of this value also brought up people's interest in becoming an inclusive community through more official processes (such as Reconciling Work's BIC/RIC process). Some expressed some hesitancy, but did name an appreciation for recognizing the broad swath of inclusions in something akin to the above statement (health status/mental ability/ socioeconomic situation/ etc).

Ultimately we came to understand that for people looking for a faith community, or even for people looking to not be turned off by a faith community's presence in their wider community, naming these things is important. We've come to understand that even if naming this isn't essential for our own participation, we recognize it *is what some others may need and Jesus calls us to be mindful of the needs of others, especially those who may have been harmed or abused previously in a different spiritual community. Because we worship a God who commands us to love one another, we first want to make sure that all others know they are welcomed by us.*

We hope this helps our community understand, appreciate, and live into our first value! In the coming weeks we will explore the additional 3 values.

Ed Quinn:



ELCA Truth & Healing Movement Opportunities!



Continuing the Work of the Assistance & Resource Center (ARC) A joint statement from Our Neighbors' Place and Operation HELP

With the discontinuation of the Assistance & Resource Center, Inc. (ARC) this year, Our Neighbors' Place and Operation HELP are developing a partnership to continue ARC's work of "providing short term financial assistance to residents of River Falls and adjacent communities to help them meet their basic needs." By adjusting service areas and leveraging the existing experience and programs of Our Neighbors' Place and Operation HELP, the two partner organizations will continue ARC's tradition of offering:

- Housing Assistance Rent matching, pay arrangements, mortgage payments
- Utilities Budgeting Sessions, payments to utility providers
- Transportation Repairs, gas cards, taxi vouchers, registration, license fees, etc.
- Miscellaneous Laundry, haircuts, work clothing, phone, vital records
- Food School meal assistance, formula, other supplementation
- Referrals Referrals & assistance for other programs

Operation HELP has been providing emergency financial assistance throughout St. Croix County, including the city of River Falls, for more than 30 years. These services include payment assistance for rent, utilities, and major car repairs. In recent years, a temporary emergency housing program (motel vouchers) has been added. Moving forward, these services will be extended to the entire River Falls School District area and adjacent communities will be added as the need and funding support is demonstrated. Applications for emergency financial services are handled entirely online (https://operationhelpstcroix.org/client-application) or by phone allowing clients to apply anytime from any location. Operation HELP has a full-time staff person dedicated to vetting emergency financial applications and working with clients, landlords, utilities companies, and repair shops to work out payment arrangements.

Our Neighbors' Place has spent the past 15 years providing help and hope to anyone in Pierce and St Croix county who is struggling to meet their basic needs. Services are delivered through 4 distinct programs: Day Center, Closet Thrift Store, Backpack Program, and Transitional Housing. Through the Our Neighbors' Place Day Center, guests in the River Falls and Ellsworth School Districts will have access to the Helping Hands Fund. This fund can provide emergency financial assistance related to vehicle costs, vital records, laundry, work clothing, and more - with a focus on priorities that support housing security. Additionally, all guests are eligible for gas cards, taxi vouchers, motel vouchers, food, showers, laundry, phone, and side by side assistance from our full time case manager. Guests who call or visit the Day Center for help will find a safe, nonjudgmental environment where all are welcome.

Although Our Neighbors' Place and Operation HELP are experienced and well-equipped operationally to respond to the discontinuation of services resulting from ARC's departure, funding for these services will be a challenge. In 2023, ARC provided approximately \$125,000 in rent and utility payments assistance to clients and approximately \$50,000 in transportation and other assistance. The continuing generosity of River Falls and Pierce County churches, businesses, clubs and organizations, and individuals will be critical to sustain these resources for local residents who are experiencing financial hardship.
