

The Ministry of HOPE's Council: Naming Our Values **Deep Look at Value 3**

HOPE Values...

- All people without exception
- Serving generously
- Spiritual Nourishment
- Our connection with creation

This week I'd like to share more with you about our third value, "Spiritual Nourishment." (For further background on HOPE Council's work on naming our values and information on the first 2 values, please see previous week's TWAH articles). As a reminder, all of our values branch out from our mission statement:

HOPE is called by God to look beyond ourselves.

We walk together in faith, treasuring all people and sharing with them the love, hope and acceptance that is in Christ.

In my listening during last year's Cottage Meeting conversations a very clear appreciation and continued longing for growing deeper in faith was evident. Many expressed a "hunger" for learning more about God and our faith together, many named the ways in which our music ministry has fed them, many named the significance of regular worship and the opportunity to commune weekly, many named the importance of strong preaching and teaching, and we recognized the ways we build, strengthen, and nourish the faith of the children and youth entrusted to us. Here is just a sampling of some of the comments:

- I see God in my everyday life
- ... in rekindling my passion for music
- ...in my favorite hymn, "Borning Cry" ...though I struggle with "spirituality," HOPE has given me opportunities to grow
- I have seen or experienced God at work through HOPE...
 - ... in participating in the musical small groups at HOPE
 - ...during Coffee & Faithful Conversation on Mondays
 - ...in strong sermons that make scripture relevant
- We sense God leading us
 - ...to expand our musical offerings
 - ...to expand opportunities for more church study groups
 - ...to strengthen our children's ministry
- I think we value:
 - ... Growing in discipleship
 - ...a focus on Jesus as the center of all we do
 - ...nourishing and uplifting worship

During our council conversation we discussed how important this area is to our life as a congregation. Without spiritual nourishment, without growing in our Baptismal identities, without challenging what we think we know, without singing the songs of God's people, without teaching these things to our children, without doing this... we are not Christ's Holy Church. Without it we are simply another club, another fraternal organization, another social purpose committee. But we are claimed and called to be so much more than that, as last week's reading from Hebrews reminds us,"Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another"

So as we move forward in faith may joyfully continue to gather to be washed in the font, fed at the table, and nourished in song, word, and relationship, together. What kind of Spiritual Nourishment do you need? What do you hope for our children? How might we feed our wider community this good spiritual food? Next week we will explore our final value, "Our Connection with Creation."

Global Refuge, formerly known as Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services (LIRS), is a nonprofit serving newcomers seeking safety, support, and a share in the American dream. For 85 years, they have welcomed those seeking refuge, upholding a legacy of compassion and grace for people in crisis. They walk alongside individuals, families, and children as they begin their new lives in the United States through their work in refugee resettlement, welcome and respite services for asylum seekers, economic empowerment and employment, and family unification for unaccompanied children. To date, they have served over 750,000 people from around the globe. At Global Refuge, welcoming newcomers isn't just their duty—it's an inherent part of their identity, rooted in their Lutheran heritage and inspired values, and serving as a testament to our unwavering commitment to those in search of refuge. Global Refuge is an ELCA partner.

Immigration was a top issue in the 2024 election and you may be left wondering how the Church can continue in ministry with immigrants and refugees. 




ELCA Truth & Healing Movement Opportunities!

Last November, Rev. Sara Bishop, NWSWI Synod Advocate for Right Relationship, joined us for an Indigenous People's service and learning opportunity on a synod resolution for Land Acknowledgements. Since then we have been studying and learning more from our indigenous siblings. We have read and discussed *An Indigenous People's History of the United States, have learned more about the Doctrine of Discovery and the ELCA's repudiation of it, and broadened our conversation to wider civic life and faith concerns as we explore how our past informs our present. All of these efforts are in line with the ELCA's wider work, "The Truth and Healing Movement," which serves to put legs onto our official repudiation statement.* This fall there have been a number of opportunities for further exploration, learning, repentance, hope, and looking toward a more just future together. As we move into the winter, opportunities continue to be available on the <u>ELCA's Truth and Healing</u> <u>Movement website!</u> Make sure to check back often to continue to challenge your understanding and grow in your love of our native siblings.

Our next upcoming opportunity will be on **January 19**, **2025** when you are invited to join Pastor Annie for a discussion on *Custer Died for Your Sins: An Indian Manifesto by Vine Deloria Jr. (Standing Rock Sioux). This book has been commended to us through the ELCA's Truth and Healing Movement's new Reading Circle. This is an opportunity for us to participate in a much wider conversation across the ELCA in its many expressions. This will be the second book written by an indigenous author that we will explore together in Christian community here at HOPE. This author brings with him a theological perspective, having graduated from one of our ELCA Seminaries, Lutheran School of Theology.*


