

This Sunday marks the beginning of Advent 2024! This year we are once again partnering with our friends at "A Sanctified Art" to bring HOPE another beautiful Advent theme, "Words for the Beginning." Here is more about the theme from its creators:

"Advent is a season of endings and beginnings. As the calendar year comes to a close, a new church year begins. Christ's birth ushers us into new ways of living and loving; and yet, the world as we know it spins madly on. In many ways, pregnant Mary was surrounded by endings—large and small, personal and political. But Mary proclaimed hope in a God who was and is making all things new. Christ's birth offered a beautiful new beginning for shepherds and Magi alike—all the while, King Herod tried to bring Christ's story to an end. When we ourselves navigate seasons filled with endings and beginnings, we need reminders. We need words that can feel like steady ground, like a path for our feet to find as we step forward into the unknown.

We have crafted an Advent series filled with blessings, with the words we need to hear again and again as we begin a new season. We imagined the words Mary would speak to her newborn son. What scriptures and stories would she impart to him? What lessons would she teach him as he grew? And so, our weekly themes may feel like the lessons we teach to children, but in reality, these are lessons we continue to learn and relearn as adults. They may sound like the messages we impart to loved ones during special ceremonies or sacred rituals. We intentionally selected scriptures that may be frequently used in weddings, ordination services, or baptisms. And so, we invite you to enter this Advent season as if you are entering a sacred new chapter, holding fast to the reminders that will bolster you for the journey ahead. As you journey through this season, may you find words for belovedness and hope. May you find words for beginning again. For no matter what you are facing, no matter what this new day brings, *love is your beginning*.

We have some special tools to enhance your exploration of this Advent Season. **Make sure to pick up the following on the front table in the sanctuary:** 

- 1. A beautiful, full-color Advent devotional specific to this year's theme
- 2. An advent calendar fit for individuals, families with children, or couples
- 3. An advent photo challenge grid so you can share your Advent journey with those in your social circles, and perhaps invite them in for the season!

Join us Sunday mornings at 9:30AM for inspirational worship and on Wednesday evenings for meal fellowship and a centering time of music, prayer, and word 5:45 -7:15PM.

#### The Ministry of HOPE's Council: Naming Our Values Deep Look at Value 4

HOPE Values...

- All people without exception
- Serving generously
- Spiritual Nourishment
- Our connection with creation

This week I'd like to share more with you about our fourth and final value, "Our Connection with Creation." (For further background on HOPE Council's work on naming our values and information on the first 2 values, please see previous week's <u>TWAH</u> <u>articles</u>). As a reminder, all of our values branch out from our mission statement:

HOPE is called by God to look beyond ourselves. We walk together in faith, treasuring all people and sharing with them the love, hope and acceptance that is in Christ.

From HOPE's inception, the people here have valued the beauty of God's creation, and particularly the plot of land we have been entrusted to care for. Over time this appreciation has grown to a wider concern for not just tending the land of our congregation's physical footprint, but to live into God's mandate in Genesis 1 to have dominion (responsibility) over what God had created. HOPE was an early partner with "Hope for Earth" (formerly "Hope for Creation), a River Falls organization founded to create a hopeful, ecologically sustainable future through collaboration, education, partnerships, advocacy, and action. This partnered work began in 2014.

In spring of 2021 the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin Assembly (which we are part of) passed a resolution in Support of Creation Care. This resolution encouraged individuals and congregations to exemplify personal and institutional care for Creation by practicing energy conservation, purchasing energy efficient items, investing in renewable energy, and eliminating single-use plastics. It also encouraged all congregations in the synod to celebrate a four-week Season of Creation in the fall, and the Synod [to] provide preaching and worship resources for this season. In the summer and fall of 2021 a small group of HOPE members came together to form our own "Green Team" to explore early practices we could encourage and to plan for our first celebration of the Season of Creation. Then in spring of 2022 the NWSWI Assembly passed another resolution for "Care of Creation Green Teams" which stated, congregations in the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin commit to taking the faithful step of caring for God's creation by forming congregational Green Teams whose on-going purpose is to promote awareness while challenging the congregation to implement effective practices that protect and promote the health of creation. HOPE was ahead of the curve for this work and our own team has assisted other local congregations in establishing their own. All of this work is rooted in long-standing theological understandings of the ELCA as discussed in the 1993 ELCA Social Statement, "Caring for Creation: Vision, Hope, and Justice."

#### The Ministry of HOPE's Council: Naming Our Values Deep Look at Value 4

In fall of 2023 during our Cottage Meeting conversations, multiple responses to the four questions that were asked revolved around an appreciation for God's creation as well as a concern for and call to care for creation. This was seen in comments like:

- I see God in my everyday life
- ... in nature, the earth, and the seasons
- ... in watching birds
- I have seen or experienced God at work through HOPE ...
- ...when HOPE brings awareness about sustainability/environmental concerns and encourages people to think how they are being called to care for environment
- ...in outdoor services
- We sense God leading us
  - ...Through our care of the environment and work with other community members/organizations
  - ...To be wise with the use of our land and have it be used as a respite for community
- I think we value:
  - ...sustainability
  - ...environmental concern
  - ...stewardship of the earth

During our council conversation this value continued to emerge. We all agreed that we have been richly blessed by this particular plot of God's creation. We know that our outdoor, "Winds of the Spirit" pavilion is a tremendous asset to our congregation and wider community. It is clear that our neighbors appreciate the community garden and nature trail spaces as a place of respite. As the development increases to the north of our facility, we appreciate the expanse of nature we still have and hope to use it in a way that honors God, our neighbors, and our mission. We celebrated that we have become 100% renewable and named that although it can be a "pinch" at times, we value the work we've done to reduce our use of one-time plastics across ministry teams. When HOPE has provided simple opportunities for people to practice new ways of being sustainable, they have embraced them. Our battery recycling, plastic film recycling, and celebration of the Season of Creation are examples of that. As "HOPE Journeys Forward" we pray that God guides us in our efforts to honor and tend to God's creation faithfully.

As you can see, this value is nestled in the work and beliefs of our own congregation, the city of River Falls, the synod which we are part of, and the wider Church body of the ELCA. It is a testimony to the beautiful ways in which we are strengthened by working together with other communities of faith and our local neighbors. God does amazing work when we look beyond ourselves!

What other ways would you like to see HOPE live into this value? How might valuing our connection with creation help us live out our faith more fully? What other relationships do you think it could help us strengthen? How might people experience God's grace through this value? Please join me in prayerfully pondering these questions.




# ELCA Truth & Healing Movement Opportunities!

Last November, Rev. Sara Bishop, NWSWI Synod Advocate for Right Relationship, joined us for an Indigenous People's service and learning opportunity on a synod resolution for Land Acknowledgements. Since then we have been studying and learning more from our indigenous siblings. We have read and discussed *An Indigenous People's History of the United States, have learned more about the Doctrine of Discovery and the ELCA's repudiation of it, and broadened our conversation to wider civic life and faith concerns as we explore how our past informs our present. All of these efforts are in line with the ELCA's wider work, "The Truth and Healing Movement," which serves to put legs onto our official repudiation statement.* This fall there have been a number of opportunities for further exploration, learning, repentance, hope, and looking toward a more just future together. As we move into the winter, opportunities continue to be available on the <u>ELCA's Truth and Healing</u> <u>Movement website!</u> Make sure to check back often to continue to challenge your understanding and grow in your love of our native siblings.

Our next upcoming opportunity will be on **January 19**, **2025** when you are invited to join Pastor Annie for a discussion on *Custer Died for Your Sins: An Indian Manifesto by Vine Deloria Jr. (Standing Rock Sioux). This book has been commended to us through the ELCA's Truth and Healing Movement's new Reading Circle. This is an opportunity for us to participate in a much wider conversation across the ELCA in its many expressions. This will be the second book written by an indigenous author that we will explore together in Christian community here at HOPE. This author brings with him a theological perspective, having graduated from one of our ELCA Seminaries, Lutheran School of Theology.*


