

I hope you have enjoyed delving into our 2024 Advent series so far! This week we dwell in the reality that each one of us is a blessing. We heard "you are a blessing" numerous times on Sunday and you've continued to hear them if you've been enjoying our Advent devotionals (still available for pick-up on table in sanctuary!). Please see last week's newsletter for more information about the theme.

As I've met with a few groups this week, I've shared the following poem during our devotion time. I've asked this question:

How does it make you feel when I tell you that "you are a blessing?" Does it make you feel weird?

Confused? Unsure? Comforted? Peaceful?j

Upon further discussion we began discussing the etymology of the word, "blessing" and I shared that the Biblical Hebrew word for blessing, מברך "berākáh (pronounced ber-ah-KHA) shares the same root as for the word, "knee," בְּבֶּר pronounced ber-ech." This sparks the image of dropping to one's knee to receive a blessing. It is an act of humility. In fact, when I hear "you are a blessing" it feels very humbling to me. If you remember in the story of the Angel Gabriel's visit to Mary she responds, "How can this be?" and I suppose I feel similarly when I hear these words.

How can this be, that me with all my faults and imperfections and imposter syndrome could possible be blessed by God?

And yet, that is precisely what we all are. For if I can acknowledge that I am a blessing, then I also must acknowledge that so is every other person I encounter. Yes, every other person.

We are named, claimed, and blessed by God to share in Christ's very ministry of bringing about the very Kingdom of God. Holy and humbling work, indeed.




ELCA Truth & Healing Movement Opportunities!

Last November, Rev. Sara Bishop, NWSWI Synod Advocate for Right Relationship, joined us for an Indigenous People's service and learning opportunity on a synod resolution for Land Acknowledgements. Since then we have been studying and learning more from our indigenous siblings. We have read and discussed *An Indigenous People's History of the United States, have learned more about the Doctrine of Discovery and the ELCA's repudiation of it, and broadened our conversation to wider civic life and faith concerns as we explore how our past informs our present. All of these efforts are in line with the ELCA's wider work, "The Truth and Healing Movement," which serves to put legs onto our official repudiation statement. This fall there have been a number of opportunities for further exploration, learning, repentance, hope, and looking toward a more just future together. As we move into the winter, opportunities continue to be available on the ELCA's Truth and Healing Movement website! Make sure to check back often to continue to challenge your understanding and grow in your love of our native siblings.*

Our next upcoming opportunity will be on **January 19, 2025** when you are invited to join Pastor Annie for a discussion on *Custer Died for Your Sins: An Indian Manifesto by Vine Deloria Jr.* (Standing Rock Sioux). This book has been commended to us through the ELCA's Truth and Healing Movement's new Reading Circle. This is an opportunity for us to participate in a much wider conversation across the ELCA in its many expressions. This will be the second book written by an indigenous author that we will explore together in Christian community here at HOPE. This author brings with him a theological perspective, having graduated from one of our ELCA Seminaries, Lutheran School of Theology.


