This week we have been invited into two untraditional Advent readings: Ruth 1 (the beginning of the story of Ruth and Naomi) and Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 ("a threefold cord is not quickly broken"). As disciples of Jesus we celebrate that we follow a God who knew this truth about us from the beginning! 


Our 2024 "Carols and Candles" evening was wonderful! Thank you to all who made it such a success!

Advent Project Theme is "Words for the Beginning"





As we continue to be a people striving after God's justice

As a member congregation of the ELCA, part of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin, and as a community of faith in River Falls striving to live into our mission to "look beyond ourselves," "treasure all people" and "share the love, hope, and acceptance that is in Christ" we are called to seriously engage in the work of the ELCA Truth and Healing Movement and we have been doing so over the course of the last year. Part of looking beyond ourselves and treasuring others is to step outside of our own experiences and narratives in order to hear and truly listen to the lived experiences of our siblings, especially those whom the Church has historically oppressed. That important listening work is one way that we not only share Christ's love, hope, and acceptance with our siblings, but a way that we also *receive Christ's love, hope, and acceptance in return*

It is the holy work of reconciliation and it is a blessing to be invited into it.

This winter we are invited to continue in our work of the **ELCA's Truth and Healing Movement** There are 2 opportunities for you this January!

1. Right Relations Training (An ELCA-wide opportunity)

An experiential training designed to provide a guide to Christian and settlerdescended volunteers who want to engage in movements for Indigenous Justice

In 2025, the Coalition to Dismantle the Doctrine of Discovery will offer monthly online training! They will rotate between "Right Relations" and "Decolonizing and Organizing for Systems Change" training modules. This coming January, the Coalition will offer online "Right Relations Training" training in 2 two-hour modules. "Right Relations Training" is an experiential training designed to provide a guide to Christian and settler-descended volunteers who want to engage in movements for Indigenous Justice.


